## Fr. Joe's Jottings

This week all the priests and the deacons of the diocese are gathering at Oacoma for the annual Clergy days. The Arrowhead Cedar Shores Motel and Convention Center really works well for all these men. We use all the lodging units for sleeping and resting. One set of convention rooms becomes our chapel for Mass and prayers with the Blessed Sacrament reserved. One set of convention rooms becomes our dining facility, and another set is for our classroom. The only part of the complex we don't commandeer is the bar but some do enjoy an adult beverage during the week.

The usual prayer times of clergy are observed along with Mass in the morning. There are also presentations by some scholars that are selected by the Education Committee. The afternoon is filled with rest and relaxation which might include either a strenuous workout or a leisurely walk. Evening sessions include pertinent issues from Bishop DeGrood's staff.

Perhaps the most beneficial aspect of the whole week is the cross-pollination of ideas from other priests and deacons of our diocese. The opportunity to share insights and experiences from other areas of the diocese is valuable. The time spent with those who have been ordained many years with those who have been ordained few years strengthen both ends of the spectrum. There is a great difference in all these individuals, but we share one common centering which is the Holy Eucharist. We are one, holy, Apostolic, and Catholic Church.



# Eucharistic WALK WITH ONE Revival

We are all called to evangelize, and, thanks to the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are well-equipped for this mission. It may not mean spreading the Gospel in a foreign land or going door-to-door with the Good News - and it may require overcoming some fears - but the Lord is asking each of us to step out of our comfort zone and evangelize one-on-one.

There is someone in your life right now whom Jesus longs to call to himself. He wants to spark a relationship with them and bless them with his sacraments. In this <u>Year of Mission</u>, Catholics across the U.S. are saying "yes" to a special form of heart-to-heart accompaniment called the *Walk With One initiative*.

This is your opportunity to be God's instrument in the life of another person. Imagine how our families, neighborhoods, and country will be transformed if every active Catholic answers this call! You might ask yourself: How do I invite someone to take a step closer to Jesus? How might I invite them forward in their faith?
