

Pentecost Sunday May 19, 2024

Father Simon Sez



How would you like to live a life of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control? All this can be yours and more! You may say, "What's the catch?" St. Paul tells the Galatians (Gal 5:16-25) that basically, all you have to do is belong to Jesus Christ and crucify your flesh with its passions and desires. Sounds easier said than done. It is!

There is no way that you will experience the above mentioned fruits of the Holy Spirit if you go at it alone. St. Paul tells us (Gal 5:17), "For the flesh has desires against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh; these are opposed to each other so that you may not do what you want." Thankfully, St. Paul gives us the remedy (Gal 5:16), "Brothers and sisters, live by the Spirit and you will certainly not gratify the desire of the flesh."

Every Sunday we need to be gathered in church at Mass, like the apostles and disciples all gathered together in one place with Mary, the Spouse of the Holy Spirit. They were gathered in the upper room waiting for the Spirit promised to them by Jesus. The Acts of the Apostles (2:1-11) from today's first reading tells us, "They were all filled with the Holy Spirit."

Last weekend and this weekend are weekends for graduation from high schools, colleges, and universities. Graduates may need to be reminded that man cannot live on vocational careers or professions alone. The queen of the sciences and the application of the sciences is Christian and Catholic philosophy and the king is Christian and Catholic theology. Even when people are educated in these, they still can error in their understanding and application. When we pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit, we specifically need to pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit listed in the Book of Isaiah 11:1-3 (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord). These were given to us in the Sacrament of Confirmation. We pray and hope our graduates will use these gifts above and beyond their educations in order to bear the fruits of the Holy Spirit in their lives!

Ultimately, we all need the Spirit of truth that comes to us through the Church founded by Jesus Christ. In today's gospel proclamation, Jesus promised the Spirit of truth to his disciples to guide them to all truth. If we want to experience the fruits of the Holy Spirit, we need to us the gifts of the Holy Spirit in accord with this truth, who is Jesus Christ, the Way, the Truth, and the Life!




